

KEY OBJECTIVES

Alcoa of Australia Limited's ('Alcoa') goal for its Anglesea Power Station and Mine location is to complete environmental assessment work consistent with the requirements of the National Environmental Protection Measure 1999 (Assessment of Site Contamination) (as amended 2013) ('NEPM') and also consistent with the final end land use strategy as it develops.

Alcoa will also ensure compliance to the requirements of the Clean Up Notice 90006380 ('Notice') as issued to the location by the Victorian Environment Protection Authority ("Authority') on 10 October 2015. The Notice requires the submission of quarterly reports on the soil and groundwater assessment activities at the Anglesea location and to confirm if any unacceptable risk to the environment has been identified. In the event of identifying contamination posing an unacceptable risk to the environment, Alcoa must develop and implement an interim clean-up plan in response to such an occurrence.

NEPM

Activities since closure:

Since the station closure on August 31st 2015, modifications to the existing onsite Water Treatment Plant were commissioned to continue to supply treated groundwater to the Anglesea River at the request of Government.

To facilitate this commissioning period, Section 30A 117000 was issued to the location on August 28 2015 with the approval expiring on October 27 2015. It should be noted that Alcoa remained compliant with the conditions of the S30A. Water has continued to be treated and discharged to the Anglesea River from the location since the commissioning period.

Planned activities for 1 December 2015 – 28 February 2016:

As required by the Notice, Alcoa Point Henry must engage an EPA-Appointed Environmental Auditor by April 1st 2016. The EPA will be notified in writing of the engagement of the auditor.

Alcoa will commence work on the development of Work Scopes for the Preliminary Site Investigations, in accordance with the NEPM.

ENVIRONMENTAL PERFORMANCE

There have been no non-compliance incidents since the cessation of operations.

IDENTIFIED UNACCEPTABLE RISKS & CLEAN UP PLAN

There have been no unacceptable risk issues identified.

COMMUNICATIONS UPDATE

Alcoa has continued to engage with the local Anglesea community by continuing its Community Consultative Network meetings. An overview of the location environmental, health and safety metrics and the site activities, which include any updates on the decommissioning work and the environmental studies, have been presented and discussed.

Since the closure announcement four Community Consultation Network ('CCN') meetings have been held with the last on 12 October, and the next scheduled for 7 December. The CCN meetings are expected to be held bimonthly or on an as needs basis by agreement with the CCN attendees at each meeting. The quarterly reports will be communicated efficiently to the CCN group. This forum continues to enable community stakeholders the opportunity to ask questions and receive information on the decommissioning project.

Several stakeholder meetings have been held with neighbours, local council and community partners where the progress of activity has been discussed.
